By supporting basic student needs, donors help break down the barriers that prevent students from reaching their full potential. This vital assistance not only helps students succeed academically but also creates lasting change, breaking the cycle of poverty for them and their families.



As student awareness about these resources grows, we anticipate the demand for emergency financial assistance and the number of requests for such aid to increase.




REPORT ON EMERGENCY FUNDS USAGE 2024-2025

In the **2024-2025 fiscal year**, the College distributed a total of 2,006 Emergency Fund awards to students, with **an average award of \$245**. Many students received multiple awards, reflecting the ongoing challenges they face.

The distribution of these funds underscores the significant need within our community.

Transportation, food, and rent—the three largest categories of assistance—**accounted for 75% of the total \$491,654** disbursed, highlighting the critical role the Emergency Fund plays in supporting students' basic needs.
